

1 Expert Available for Timely Analysis of SCOTUS Health Care Case

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This Tuesday the Supreme Court is hearing arguments for *Health and Hospital Corp. v Talevski*, a case that could eliminate safeguards that protect against unlawful terminations of federal assistance programs like Medicaid.
